Dr John Vallance

Member of the Library Council of NSW, Headmaster, Sydney Grammar School

He is a classical scholar who taught at Cambridge and is Headmaster of Sydney Grammar School, and joins us for this seminar day in his capacity as a member of the Library Council of NSW.

Catriona Arcamone

Head Teacher English, Fort Street High School

Catriona Arcamone is Head Teacher English at Fort Street High School. She has regularly taught Extension 2 English almost since its inception, and has been an Extension 2 marker for a number of years. Currently she is a Senior Marker for Extension 1 English. A number of her students have been included in Young Writers Showcase over the years. Catriona presented at the word eXpress Seminar Day in 2015, and at the Extension 2 Students and Teachers seminar held by the English Teachers Association in 2016.

Dr Felicity Plunkett

Poet, critic and editor and former Chief Examiner-English Extension 1 and 2

Felicity Plunkett is a poet, critic and editor. She has a PhD in Literature from the University of Sydney and has taught at a number of universities, gaining an Excellence in Teaching Award from the University of New England. From 2004 - 2009 she was Chief Examiner of English Extension 1 and 2. Her poetry collection, *Vanishing Point*, won the Arts Queensland Thomas Shapcott Award and was short-listed for several other awards. She is also the author of a chapbook *Seastrands* (Vagabond Press, 2011). Felicity is Poetry Editor with UQP and edited the collection *Thirty Australian Poets* (UQP, 2011).

Creative Essentials – Dr Felicity Plunkett

This session will focus on an array of inspiring ideas and resources to support you as you create your Major Work. It will draw on research on creativity and advice drawn from the experiences of a range of professional writers and composers.

This session focuses on the course requirements, including the interconnected roles of Major Work, Reflection Statement and Journal, equips you with the latest Board of Studies updates, and covers time management against the ticking clock! It will also touch on the experience of students and their teachers as they navigate their way to the finished product.

Rigorous research is a requirement of the course and the State Library of NSW has extraordinary online resources to inspire, inform and enrich your research. This session will reveal the vast repository of the resources available to you in the comfort of your own home.

In this session students will have the opportunity to view award-winning student works and unpack the critical elements that contributed to its success.

Ongoing reflection aides the development of creative work and this session will equip students with strategies and techniques to work towards a thoughtfully crafted Reflection Statement and productive creative reflection. If, as Steve Kowit puts it, 'the secret of writing is rewriting', using creative reflection to power your redrafting will help you refine and further your work.
