For All Time: Shakespeare in Print

The Library's latest exhibition celebrates the First Folio, the first edition of the collected plays of the famous playwright and storyteller, William Shakespeare, which was published 400 years ago this year. The First Folio contains 36 plays, with 18 never before recorded in print. Without the First Folio we may have forever lost plays including Macbeth, The Tempest and As You Like It.

The State Library holds Australia's only copy of Shakespeare's First Folio, along with the three other Folios published in the 17th century. Displayed alongside our significant Shakespeare collection, this exhibition shares the stories behind Shakespeare's plays and investigates how the works of the most famous English playwright in history have been reimagined across generations.

For All Time: Shakespeare in Print is on display in the Amaze Gallery now until Sunday 25 February 2024. A series of curator tours, talks and other events will take place in the months ahead to celebrate the exhibition and the 400th anniversary of the First Folio. Learn more <u>here</u>.

2022–23 multicultural bulk loan statistics

2022–23 saw the highest demand for multicultural bulk loans over a 5-year period with a total of 75,135 items circulated.

We saw a significant increase in demand for Ukrainian, Nepalese, Urdu and Arabic language material. This is the first time Arabic is placed among the top 10 languages.

84 NSW library services made use of our Multicultural Bulk Loan Service in 2022–23 compared to 77 in 2020–21. This include 83 NSW public libraries and the Metropolitan Remand & Reception Centre (MRRC) Library at Silverwater.

Of the 83 NSW public libraries, 30 were from the metropolitan region and 52 from regional NSW.

The Finding Answers with Damian webinars feature topics aligned with the NSW school curriculum. This includes Exploring the Rise of Fake and Fast News using Gale in Context: Global Issues, examining the issue of misinformation as a societal issue. Law Week 2023



Digitised NSW subdivision plans

Subdivision plans are a goldmine for genealogists and local historians — they provide a glimpse into the past and are filled with fascinating details. Produced by real estate agents from the 1880s to the 1930s, these ephemeral plans were usually discarded once a site was sold.

Following the digitisation of Sydney subdivision plans a number of years ago, we are thrilled to announce that over 4,600 historic plans of 460 regional towns in NSW are now digitised and available for the first time on the State Library's website. The State Library launches Atlas Club

The State Library has just launched a free afterschool club for curious kids called Atlas. Atlas brings together three online clubs — Art Club, Young Writers Club and Book Lovers Club — and is designed for young people between the ages of 5 and 15 years. Each club meets regularly during school term from 4–5 pm for interactive online sessions led by Library educators, with special guest appearances by authors and illustrators.
