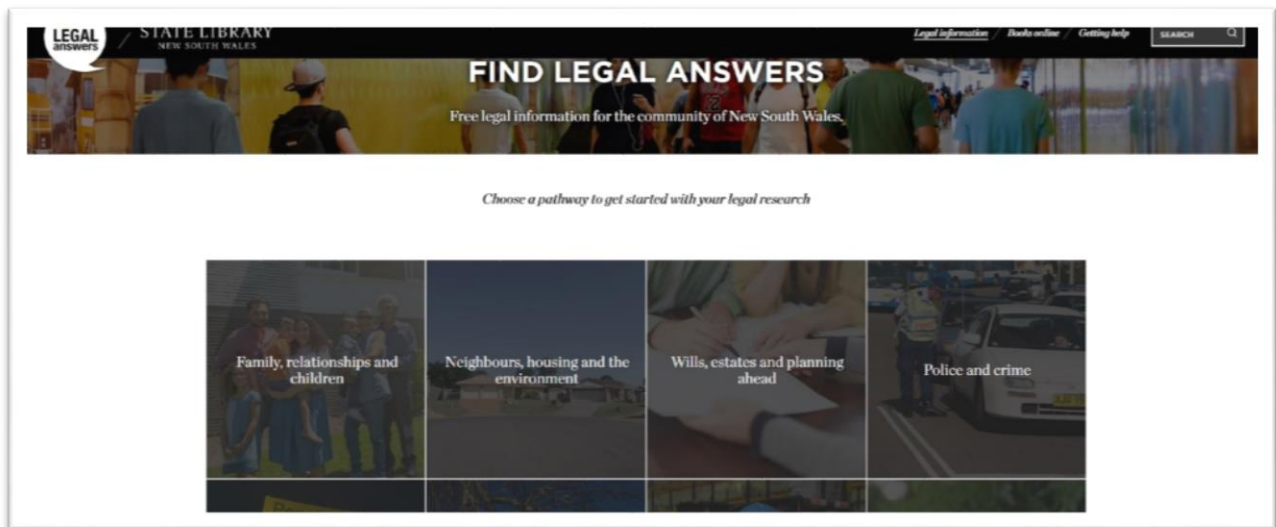


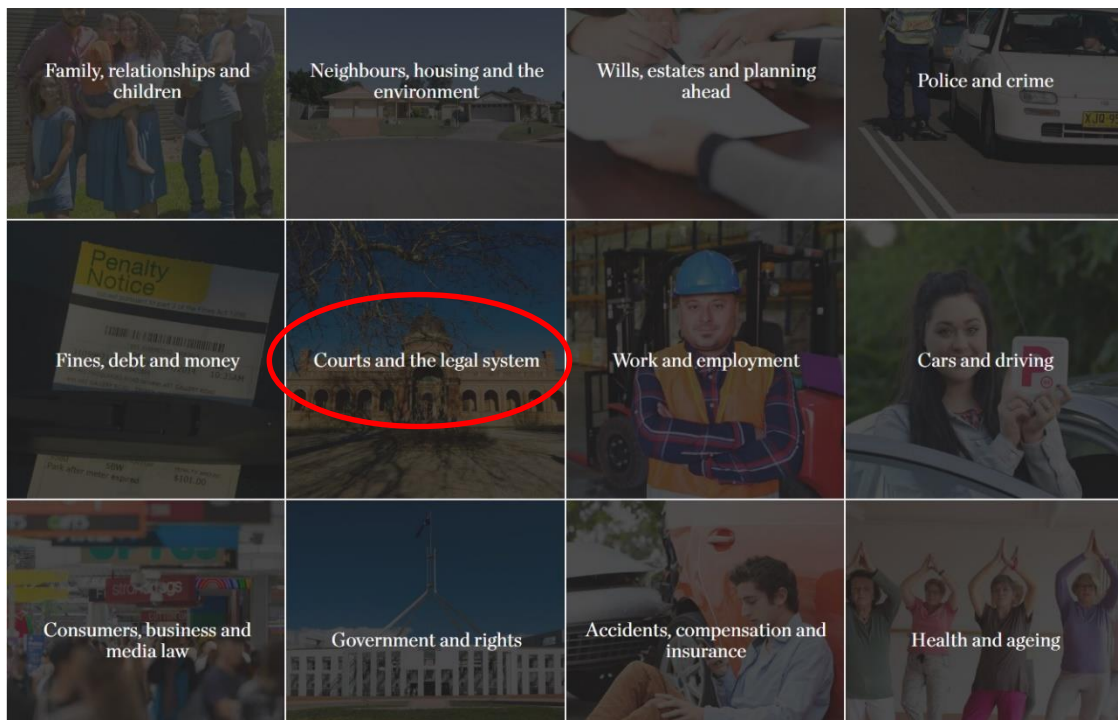

NSW online registry, Courts and Tribunals (NSW)

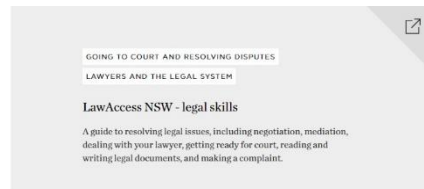


Court clients can file online over 80 civil forms for the Supreme, Land and Environment, District and Local Courts with the NSW Online Registry. Online forms include statement of claim and affidavit.

The NSW Online Registry YouTube channel has a number of short instructional videos to help clients register, file specific forms and use the website.

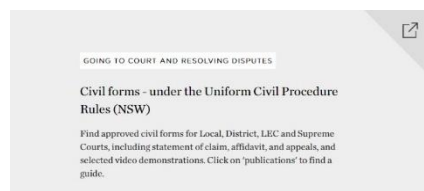
To log on you will need ID documents, a credit card and an email address.

The *Reading and writing legal documents* section includes information about understanding and preparing legal documents, including affidavits, statements and statutory declarations. Includes sample forms and step by step guides.

Civil forms - under the Uniform Civil Procedure Rules, Department of Justice (NSW)



Approved civil forms for Local, District, Land and Environment and Supreme Courts including statement of claim, affidavit, appeals, and tree dispute application. Forms arranged numerically. Links to pdf and word versions, and to online registration if applicable. Also links to a guide to completing approved forms.
