## Review of the Library Regulation

NSW regulations are reviewed every five years, and it is time for the review of the Library Regulation 2018.

The State Library has prepared a <u>consultation document and an accompanying feedback form</u> for consultation with public libraries.

Feedback on the regulation is welcomed by 5 pm, Friday 13 October 2023.

## 2023/24 Public Library Infrastructure Grants

The <u>2023/24 Public Library Infrastructure Grants</u> are now open. Applications are due by 5 pm, Friday 27 October 2023.

Public Library Infrastructure Grants of up to \$500,000 are for projects that will assist NSW councils to improve public library infrastructure, such as buildings, spaces and information technology (including digitisation projects).




# Drug Info for youth areas and digital signage
